

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

BACTERIOLOGICAL SAMPLING FAILURE FOR TIMBER COVE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT

Our water system failed to conduct the required routine bacteriological sampling during July 2025, pursuant to the regulations, and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Even though this failure was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct this situation.

What happened?

We are required to monitor your drinking water for total coliform bacteria by collecting at least one water sample every month and testing it for bacteria. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During July 2025, we failed to conduct routine bacteriological sampling of the drinking water. Therefore, we cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. If you have health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What are we doing to correct this situation?

Timber Cove County Water District must ensure that routine bacteriological monitoring is conducted timely and in accordance with the California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Section 64423. We have improved our routine sample procedures and submitted all routine samples with the state consistently every month since.

Please share this information with other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this public notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- SCHOOLS: Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).

- RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants and employees.
- BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS: Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.
